On Friday 15th March a superb talk was given by Tanya and Edmund Hoare on "Saving our Swifts". They presented a remarkable first hand photographic record of the Swifts nesting in their house in Lowgill near Sedbergh. When their house needed re-roofing twenty years ago they took the opportunity to improve the space where Swifts were nesting, and to enable photographic recording by infra-red cameras accessed from their bathroom. Swifts arrive in early May and depart for Africa in early August. The same birds return to the same nest year after year. More nesting pairs can be encouraged to nest nearby in the same building if other entrance holes and platforms are available. Tanya and Edmund now have many pairs, and their photos and video sequences show all stages of the nestlings developing. Provision of suitable nesting sites in our buildings seems to be crucial for Swifts in Britain, and examples of bricks with entrance holes, or complete boxes, were on display. Most important is that buildings which have nesting Swifts should be maintained or improved with the needs of the Swifts in mind.

The April meeting will be in the Hornby Institute at 7.45pm on Friday 12th April (the Friday before Good Friday) when Phil Dykes will give an illustrated talk on "Badgers ... Ecology and Issues".

April Excerpts from Hornby School Log-Books 1900-94**1901**

4th April - Prepared return showing age and attendance of children for Colonel W.H. Foster's Attendance Medals. Margaret Kelsall, Alice Ripley, Sarah Ellen Hodgson and Fred Ripley have never missed.

1902

7th April - Mrs. Foster's Annual Treat and distribution of presents took place on Thursday last and had been postponed owing to epidemic of Measles. Admitted Elizabeth Hartley an inmate of the Workhouse and lately of Quernmore Park. She is between 7 and 8 years old.

1921

6th April - Took gardening children to Castle Orchard to hear an address on grafting.

8th April - Let children stay in school yard from 9.15 to 10.30 to witness the eclipse of the sun.

1924

7th April - Mary Johnson Standard One was found to be suffering from Diphtheria. I sprayed the school with Jeyes Fluid and flushed the drains.

1926

12th April - School re-opened after Easter holidays. Admitted 7 boys from the Institution. These boys are weak minded

1929

8th April - The boys WC's do not flush properly and the basins are never properly clear of dung.

1931

21st April - Bert Driffield fell on his way to school and became unconscious. The headmaster found him lying near a stone heap not far from Butt Yeats Farm and had him conveyed home. Irene

Schofield fell in the girls' yard and damaged her leg.

1938

27th April - Sergeant Cubbon lectured the children on "Danger on the road".

1941

21st April - The windows have been covered with protective covering against air raids and the floors have been washed.

1944

3rd April - In the 'Salute the Soldier' drawing and slogan competition Audrey Crayston won the first prize 15shillings certificate in class C of drawing and in class A of slogan Malcolm Cowell was 1st - 15 shillings, Alan Davies 2nd - 10 shillings, Audrey Crayston 3rd - 5 shillings.

1944

3rd April - In the 'Salute the Soldier' drawing and slogan competition Audrey Crayston won the first prize 15shillings certificate in class C of drawing and in class A of slogan Malcolm Cowell was 1st - 15 shillings, Alan Davies 2nd - 10 shillings, Audrey Crayston 3rd - 5 shillings.






