Neighbourhood Watch has today launched a landmark new survey to understand the impact of cybercrime on communities across England and Wales. Traditionally Neighbourhood Watch has been focused on keeping people safe in the places they live but with the advent of new technology, it's clear people can be at their most vulnerable when they occupy online spaces.

Action Fraud, the national fraud and cybercrime reporting centre run by the City of London Police, revealed that last year cybercrime victims <u>lost £28m to online criminals</u>. It reports more than 12,000 cases of cybercrime every six months. With the threat from online criminals only ever increasing, it is essential we understand the impact this type of crime has on members as well as their understanding and perception of cybercrime.

The survey, designed in conjunction with cybersecurity company <u>Avast</u>, takes just 10 minutes to complete with one lucky responder in with a chance to win £50 worth of Marks and Spencer vouchers. #### **Request for volunteers**

Lancashire Resilience Forum (LRF) is planning a large-scale live play multi-agency exercise for 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> November 2019 in the west of the county – exact location to be confirmed.

To assist with the exercise and to enable the scenario to be as realistic as possible we require a large number of volunteers to play various roles such as casualties, witnesses and survivors.

Option 1 - 6<sup>th</sup> November required from 1600hrs (involvement may go through to the early hours)

Option 2 - 7<sup>th</sup> November required from 0830hrs to 1330hrs

Option 3 - 7<sup>th</sup> November required from 0830hrs to 1630hrs

- Expenses will not be able to be claimed for this exercise.
- Joining instructions will be sent to you nearer the time.
- If at any point you have volunteered and then find you can no longer participate, please let us know.
- Participants must be over 16yrs on the date of the exercise.

#### **Knife Crime**

If you know someone who is carrying a knife don't keep silent. Report it. Call Lancashire Constabulary on 101 or report knife crime anonymously to the independent charity Crimestoppers who can be contacted anonymously on 0800 555 111 or online at crimestoppers-uk.org.

Some people think carrying a knife protects you. What they don't realise is carrying a knife doesn't protect you. If you carry a knife and you get into a fight you might be tempted to use your knife. You may have never intended using it but before you know it you've stabbed someone or your knife has been used against you.

#### Knives and the law

Just by carrying a knife you could end up in court. It is illegal to carry a knife, even if it belongs to somebody else and if you are caught you will be arrested.

Anyone who is carrying a knife and is intending to use it as a weapon – even in self-defence can be arrested, go to court and receive a police record or even a prison sentence. The police can search anyone they suspect of carrying a knife.

Some people say that they carry a knife for protection or to make them feel safer, even though they wouldn't think of using it. However, research has shown that you're actually more likely to become a victim of crime if you're carrying a knife.

The maximum prison sentence for carrying a knife is four years, but if you use the knife in a crime or to injure someone the penalties are a lot worse. Under 'joint enterprise' rules, prosecutors also have the power to bring before the courts people who were present when a crime was committed so that all face the same serious charges.

#### Don't be a victim

If you feel you are in immediate danger from knife crime there are a number of steps you can take to protect yourself:

- Move away from the situation towards a public place (shop, house, restaurant etc.) as quickly as possible.
- Make as much noise as you can.
- Instead of carrying a knife, carry a personal alarm.
- Don't fight back.

Does your boyfriend, girlfriend, partner or someone in your family carry a knife? If you have an argument could they turn it on you? If you are frightened that someone you know may harm you with a blade or you are being hurt by someone you love and don't know what to do, there are lots of people and organisations that want to help and can help you.

#### **Community Champions**

The Community Champion role is a new uniformed volunteer role being piloted throughout Lancashire to Local Parish/Town Councils. It is being managed through Our Lancashire and the role is 1-6 hrs per week to act as a Community ambassador for the local town or parish Council who will work with their champions to do things like community engagement, school liaison, reassurance patrols, organise community events and act a community link. Training and uniform will be provided. So far, Garstang, Hesketh Bank, Coppull, Longridge, Earby, Sabden and St Anne's have all signed up and we have 6 Champions being trained up.
